

WOODLAND WALK

(Please follow signs)

This wood forms part of the Whittlewood Forest which is an ancient forest and an area of Special Scientific Interest.

These woodlands are all managed in accordance with plans approved of by English Nature and the Forestry Authority.

This woodland walk is through an area recently opened up to allow in more daylight to benefit plants and wildlife. The tree tops etc. are left to rot down in order to provide a habitat for beetles and other insects.

You will see many of the following species of wild plants.
